INDIPENDENCE DAY CELEBRATION WITH PVTGs

Comprehensive Report



Special Celebration of the 78th Independence Day on
15th August with Tribal Communities, including PVTGs

In accordance with the instructions received from the Ministry of Tribal Affairs, New Delhi, for the 78th Independence Day, each Tribal Research Institute (TRI) was directed to celebrate the 78th Independence Day in a special manner in their respective states. Specifically, it was advised to organize celebrations with PVTGs (Particularly Vulnerable Tribal Groups) communities in villages with a significant population of Primitive Tribes. Various programs were to be conducted to educate the PVTGs communities about the country's Independence Day, the "Har Ghar Tiranga" campaign, and its special significance, as well as to provide information about the work done under state government and PM-JANMAN schemes. In the past year, considering the developmental initiatives launched by the Government of India and especially by the Honorable Prime Minister for Adivasis and PVTGs, the celebration of the 78th Independence Day was to include prominent national campaigns such as "Har Ghar Tiranga," "Tiranga Yatra," "Ek Ped Ek Naam," and the PM JANMAN and Sickle Cell Anemia campaigns. These programs were particularly aimed at motivating Tribes and PVTGs communities. To raise awareness about these initiatives, it was instructed to plan and organize various events for the 78th Independence Day on 15th August.
